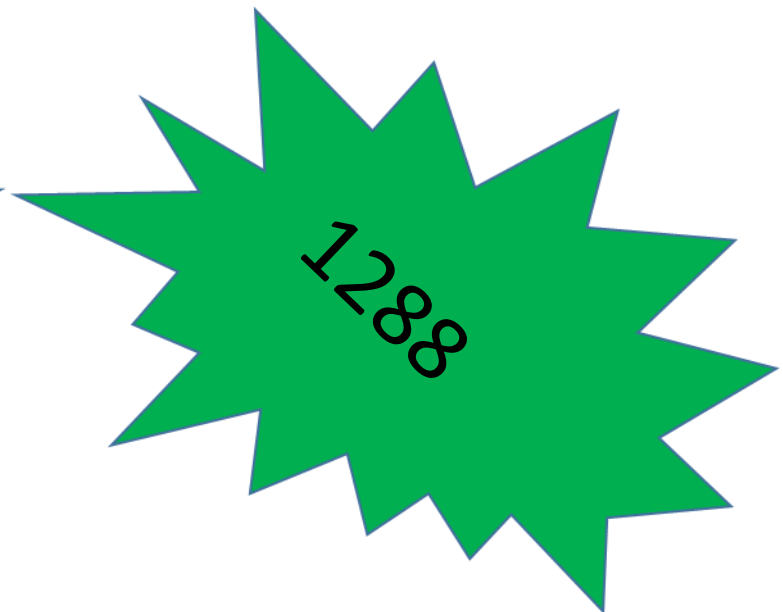
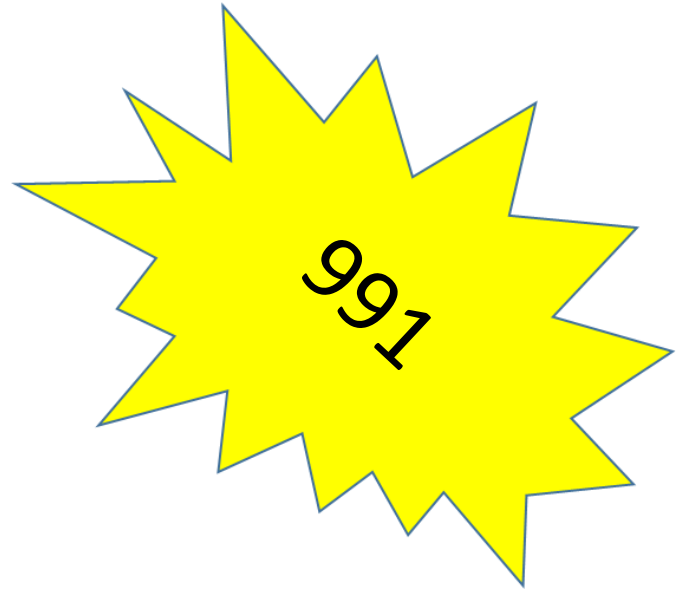

Thank you for everything you have done along with your hard work, care and dedication. We will miss you, and we wish you every success in your new role. From everyone at Roche School.

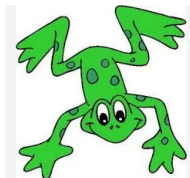


## Congratulations

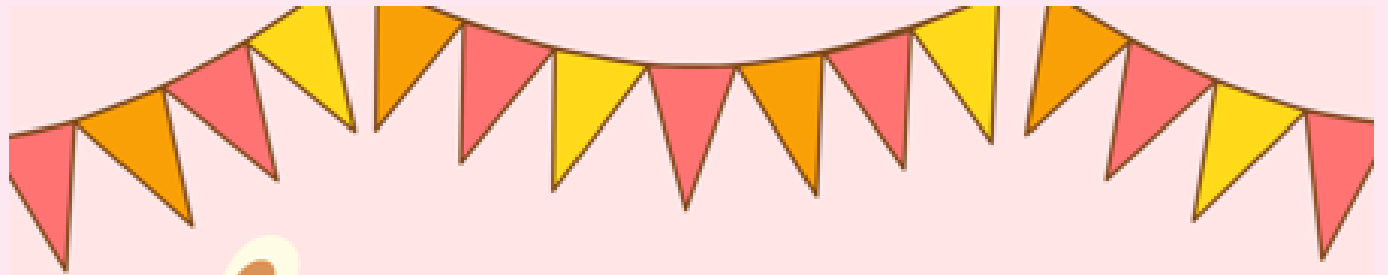
