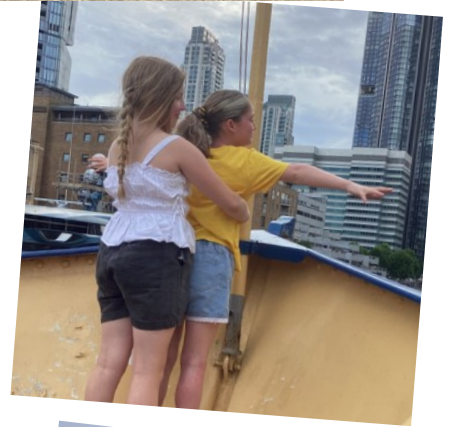

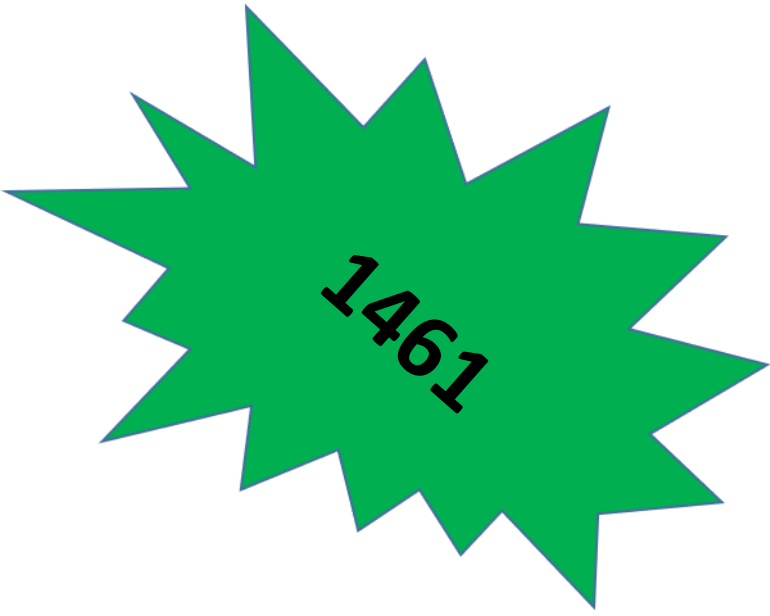

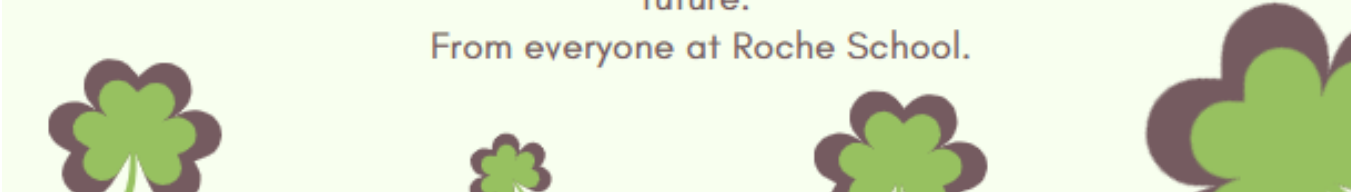


Good luck, Miss Goatman
